Note from the Composer

Be Thou My Vision has always been one of my favorite hymns. Each verse is a beautifully crafted prayer, and I encourage the choir to read and consider the text carefully. This arrangement preserves the traditional melody—making only minor alterations—while setting each verse in a way that reflects the meaning of the text. With every stanza, the poet focuses ever more resolutely on God as her soul's deepest desire and ultimate joy.

The setting of the first verse is notably simple, presenting the melody against lush, wordless choral backgrounds. The rest of the song is built on this essential foundation. In verse two, the pillars of wisdom and truth are reflected in the chordal writing, which supports the melody with strength and unity. The descant must add to, not overpower the melody.

In verse three, the near-constant eighth notes weave a tapestry of counterpoint reflecting the myriad of distractions that assail us. At m. 63-64, the relentless movement ceases, and all voices move inward to a true unison, emphasizing again the singularity of focus on God, the treasure. At m. 85, the triumphant key change anticipates the arrival at "heaven's joys." The arrangement pays homage to a traditional homophonic hymn setting, yet every melodic note is harmonized with a unique, richly textured chord, mirroring the delights awaiting us in eternity.

This arrangement, composed for my wedding, was originally recorded with six singers, one per part. I have found that it works equally well with choruses large and small, each ensemble's performance taking on a distinct character depending on its size. It is a true delight to see this arrangement living on in churches and the concert hall.
